




The sculpture is a series of rings that align to suggest a path. "The Path Untraveled" will not be traveled by people. It crisscrosses the designated paths for people in a way that creates new visual corridors. The artwork suggests new perspectives through the landscape.






The artwork conveys flow and balance. It's scale works with the large bridges and structures surrounding the site, balancing size with the elegance of a single curving line bobbing in and out of view.




Richmond is a very exciting place! The artwork I am presenting is the result of profoundly moving experiences I have had while in Richmond.

These sculptures are created in a way that balances natural beauty with the imagination.




This is a place to connect with nature, a center of contemporary human activity and a robust environment. There are not many places that are so magnificent.




